### THE REPORT ON THE 2-WEEKS TRAINING WORKSHOP ON CRITICAL SKILLS ACQUISITION ON SCAFFOLDING AND PRIMARY ACCESS

Below is the report on the “2-WEEKS TRAINING WORKSHOP ON CRITICAL SKILLS ACQUISITION ON SCAFFOLDING AND PRIMARY ACCESS”. The training started with:

#### The Selection Process

The selection process commence by 9<sup>th</sup> December, 2019 with Radio Announcement at Radio Bayelsa and one other Radio station, for two weeks, during which applicants were requested to apply on-line. The applications were screened based on the following criteria:

1. Geographical spread based of the eight LGA’s
2. Academic Qualifications –WASC, NECO, OND, HND, BSC, etc.
3. Technical/Vocational Skills – NTC/ANTC, NABTE, Trade Test, HSE, Competency- Certificate of Apprenticeship etc.

After a painstaking screening, oral interview and verification of credentials, 20 (twenty) persons were selected. See attached details of the successful trainees in table 1 in the appendix.

### **Accommodation, Transportation and Security**

The trainees arrived at the training centre on Tuesday (07/01/2020) and were accommodated at Randolph Hotel situated at No. 101 Old Aba Road, Rumuogba in Port Harcourt. The trainees were conveyed from their hotel accommodation in a 32-Sitter Bus, fully Air Conditioned, with Security Personnel from the Nigeria Police, to the venue of the training on a daily basis.

### **Commencement of Training**

The training proper commenced on Wednesday (08/01/2020), and was concluded on Tuesday, 21/01/2020. The venue of the training is Phildamm Training Centre, No. 20 Market Lane, Rumumasi, Port Harcourt, Rivers State.

### **Intensive Classroom Sessions (Day 1-Day5)**

Training commences every day by 9.00am - 4.00pm, with tea break by (10.00-30.00am) and lunch break by (12.30-1.30pm). The first five days are intensive

classroom session involving materials from the following areas, while the remaining days were practical sessions:

- i. Introduction to the course of scaffolding
- ii. Legislations, Codes, Terminologies
- iii. Preventing falls in scaffolding
- iv. Basic scaffolding components and their integrity requirement
- v. Scaffolding foundations
- vi. Independent scaffolds, putlog scaffolds, tower scaffolds, mobile scaffolds, birdcage scaffolds, system scaffold, cantilever scaffolds, slung/hanging scaffolds

### **Practical Sessions (DAY 6 – DAY 14)**

The practical session involved training on Independent scaffolds, tower and mobile scaffolds, birdcage scaffolds, assessment test and the passing out ceremony. See attached photographs of the training session in the appendix.

### **Training on Critical Soft Skills**

The trainees were exposed to **Critical Soft Skills for Sustainable Career and Professional Growth**. It entails exposing them to various **websites** and how to access them. They were also exposed to professional bodies associated with scaffolding for professional/career development.

### **Monitoring/Supervision of Training**

During the training, Dr. (Mrs.) Koroye Grace and Engr. Jonjon Olali of the Board (Bayelsa State Science and Technology Board) and Dr. Denenu Emmanuel and Engr. Duncan representing ROD-DEI (Consultants), monitored the training program on a daily basis, to ensure a hitch-free training. The Chairman of the Board, Prof. (Mrs.) Ayebaemi Spiff, Pastor Moses Harold also visited. The Executive Secretary (with others) from EDTF (Education Development Trust Fund) paid a visit to monitor the extent of training and the condition of trainees.

There was no training on Sundays due to logistics lapses from the consultants, even though the trainer was willing to train. In spite of this, it wasn't a bad

development because it enables the trainees to refresh against the following week, after undergoing intensive daily training sessions.

### **The Hands-on Training**

At the conclusion of the 2-Weeks Industry Standard Training (Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> January, 2020) at Port Harcourt, the **Hands-on Training** commenced on Monday, 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2020 at Megastar Technical and Construction Company Ltd and is expected to conclude in two months time.

The hands-on training started with an orientation programme at the Company's headquarters (office) at Imiringi road, Yenagoa and the trainees were later taken their (Megastar) job site, a project owned by NCDMB (Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board, at Emeyal I (One) Ogbia LGA. The following Tuesday (22/01/2020) and practical hands-on training is on-going.
